In die vorige uitgawe het ek genoem van die oulike boekie, *The Village Carpenter*, wat ek gelees het. Ek is 'n ywerige leser van houtwerkboeke en -tydskrifte en so met die jare saam het ek, teen 'n aardige bedraggie, 'n goeie boekery opgebou. Dis nou net hier waar die geneuk begin - sien, ek kan nie verby 'n boekwinkel [of hardware winkel] stap nie. Ek kry dan ook eerste koers na die tydskrifte afdeling en dan na die houtwerkboeke. Dis loutere plesier om so deur hulle te blaai en na al die projekte, tegnieke, wenke en diesmeer te kyk.

Die verskeidenheid en omvang van die onderwerpe is iets om oor huistoe te skryf - elke denkbare faset van ons stokperdjie word aangespreek. Daar is dik boeke, maer boeke, lang boeke en kort boeke. Boeke met kleurprente en boeke met sketse of fotos, Brits en Amerikaans. Gooi maar gerus 'n ogie oor die boeke wat bv by Hardware Centre beskikbaar is. Party het baie en goeie inligting en ander weer minder. Daar is egter een ding wat hulle almal in gemeen het - **hulle is peperduur** [wat is nie?].

Toe ek *Practical Woodworking* vir die eerste maal gekoop het, het dit my net mooi R3.50 gekos. Dit het daarna vir 'n paar jaar op sewe Rand iets gestaan. *The Woodworker* daarteen het dubbel soveel gekos ten spyte van die feit dat die Britse prys presies dieselfde vir albei tydskrifte was. Ek het sover gegaan om vir CNA te skryf om bietjie lig op hierdie verskynsel te werp. Tot vandag toe het ek nog geen antwoord ontvang nie. En, toe eensklaps, iewers in verlede jaar, spring *Practical Woodworking* na R29.95 [R6.00 duurder as *The Woodworker*]. Dis om van naartoe te word. Saam gaan *Practical Woodworking*, *Good Woodworking*, *The Woodworker* en *Traditional Woodworking* [almal Britse tydskrifte] jou die aardige bedraggie van R115.60 per maand kos. As jy dan nog die Amerikaanse tydskrif, *Fine Woodworking* ook koop, dan moet man maar begin ligloop vir vroulied. Dan praat ons nie eers oor boeke nie.

Die probleem is dat elkeen van hierdie tydskrifte interessante en leersame leesstof bevat. 'n Mens kan seker verslaaf word aan hierdie tydverdryf, maar gelukkig is dit nie so dodelik soos dwelms en ander dinge nie. Die vraag is, wat staan 'n man te doen? Dit lyk mos vir my asof iemand of iets daarop uit is om al die lêkker lewensplesiertjies soos treigny, piekniek ...ens, van ons te wil ontnem. Iemand sê "selektief lees ou maat", maar wat om te selekteer? "Selfdisipline" sê 'n ander. Dis 'n moontlike opsie, maar dit werk nie altyd nie. Miskien is die oplossing om "saamleeskringe", soos saamryklubs, te stig. Vier manne koop maandeliks een tydskrif en dan ruil hulle ondermekaar uit.

A LOST CAUSE?

Sometime, early last year, I started writing about the TV cabinet I was making. It was also to be my piece for the exhibition. Well, it was never completed [to my wife's dismay] because of other external commitments and because I developed a hang-up on the overall design. So it was conveniently "filed".

A few months ago, following a somewhat sarcastic remark of "firewood" cluttering up the workshop, I decided to revamp the design and give it another go - my honour was now at stake. So, I am happy to be reporting once again that the making is going on nicely and that I am actually enjoying it.

It was also a good opportunity to put my new *Triton Workcentre* to test. To date I am mighty pleased with it and, apart from the dust it generates, not being enclosed, it has been a joy to use. Both ripping and cross-cutting is smooth and accurate. The riving knife, mitre guide and parallel fence are a pleasure to use being easy to adjust and accurate. The latest cuts were mitres cut on 90 x 23mm *Rosewood* using the mitre fence set to 45 deg and locked to the table. All the cuts were perfect straight from the saw, something that I did not achieve with my late radial arm and table saw.

The router table is the next to be put through it's paces and I will be giving feedback in the next issue.

Letter to the Editor

The writer of the following letter was adamant that I place it in the newsletter notwithstanding my plea not to do so.

"Early on the last Saturday morning of June I had to make a decision whether I should attend the demonstration by Vlooi van Rooyen on dovetail joints. I had made dovetail joints before with varying quality, none good and none to be proud of. They are hard work both in marking out and in the execution. So I thought,

Fortunately I decided to attend. I was surprised to find only four other enthusiasts there. Those that did not attend certainly missed a golden opportunity to learn.

Vlooi is a craftsman. Vlooi is also an expert demonstrator and a professional teacher. He starts at the beginning [aesthetics] and flows through the process at the right pace for the audience giving tips all the time. [Do you know the correct grain orientation for drawer sides and which piece should have the tails - thicker or thinner piece? - and more].

Vlooi had precut a double lapped dovetail and a through

dovetail with mitre which were available for reference - these also established his qualifications to do the demonstration. They were perfect, beautifully so. Then he proceeded to mark out, cut and chop [so gently and accurately] tails and pins, giving advice and demonstrating his skills. Lastly, Vlooi produced the most exciting dovetail joint he had cut the night before - pins so fine that the end was the thickness of a fine dovetail saw! A masterpiece, a piece-de-resistance.

We were impressed. Never again will I view dovetail joints as a pain. For those who attended, dovetails are a challenge and a joy. We all thank Vlooi for the time and trouble he took to enrich our woodworking lives."
